Age Eligibility

From 2014, those children who have a fifth birthday prior to the 1st May are able to begin school on the first day of Term 1 of that year. Children who turn five after 1st May cannot start school until the following year. The compulsory age at which children are expected to be enrolled in school remains at 6 years of age.

Proof of Age

At the time of enrolment parents/guardians are required to provide proof of their child's birth age. Passport, Birth certificate, or Official Centrelink documentation stating the child's name and birth date are accepted documentation required by the school.

Criteria for Consideration

Parents can still apply for enrolment in out-of-zone primary and secondary schools, however acceptance in these schools will depend on whether the number of enrolments exceeds the number of places available.

Selection of out-of-zone students is based on the following Department of Education and Child Development

- Distance
- Social and Family Links
- Transport/Location Convenience
- Disability
- Sibling Rights Rule
- Sibling Rights Rule-Half and Step Brothers and Sisters
- Proof of Residence/Change of Address
- Students who claim to have a primary place of residence with a relative/friend
- Australian Defence Force students
- Extended Enrolment
