Some unique features of the school include a shared community oval and full-sized gymnasium.

- Student enrolment trends:
 - Enrolments are increasing due to the rapid housing development in the area. A large percentage of the enrolments are from younger families with preschool and junior primary aged children. The school has been zoned to Angle Vale residents since 2018.
- Public transport access:
 - Public and private bus services operate daily.

 - There is a joint use agreement with City of Playford for the use of the main oval.



2. Students (and their welfare)

General characteristics:

The majority of students are of English speaking backgrounds. 6% of students are from non - English speaking backgrounds. 5% of students are Aboriginal, 24% of students are school card holders, and 15% are NEP students. There are composite classes in most year levels.

Student well-being programs: School is implementing Zones of Regulation.

Student support offered: Aboriginal Community Education Officer Early Intervention - Reception, Year 1

• Student management:

Angle Vale Primary School is implementing PBL.

• Student government:

Authentic student voice is a priority. The main forum for student voice in the school is Student Governing Council. School captains and vice captains are nominated in Term 1 and are elected through a class meeting process, each class elects 2 Student Governing Council Representatives.

Student Wellbeing Leader coordinates the R-6 Student Governing Council meetings which are held fortnightly. Student Governing Council Meetings are usually held at a set time in the staff room. On the alternative fortnight, Council Executives made up of two school captains and vice captains meet to discuss, plan and follow up on business discussed at Student Governing Council Meetings. Student Governing Council members can become a part of Council Executive by way of a written application, to set criteria.

The core business of Student Governing Council is to facilitate whole school wellbeing through consultation with all classes.

Special programmes:

Special programs available to students include SAPSASA sports, Book Week, Whole School Assemblies, and incursions and excursions.

3. Key School Policies

• Site Improvement Plan and other key statements or policies:

The Angle Vale Primary school is committed to working with the school community to provide high quality, relevant education and care for all students. The current school priorities are; Literacy and Numeracy.

4. Curriculum

Subject offerings:

The school implements the Australian Curriculum. Students participate in lessons in across all areas of the curriculum. All classes have specialist lessons in PE, Science and Italian, whilst R-4 students have specialist lessons in HASS. English and Mathematics have a high priority in all classes.

Special needs:

Student Learning Plans are active documents that assist staff to set achievable goals, programme and identify relevant accommodations for students. Parents are involved in the development of the students' plans. Small group and individual support is provided for students with special learning needs. School Support Officers work with class teachers to support students with special needs either in the class or through small group intervention.

• Teaching methodology:

Staff are expected to use an Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI) approach to their teaching and to differentiate pedagogy to include the range of learners in their classrooms. The school is well resourced, and resources are used throughout the school to increase the engagement and relevance to students learning. All classrooms have access to iPads, Surfaces and laptop computers. Commitments were made in the 2024 School Budget for 7 new interactive smartboards.

Student assessment procedures and reporting:

Parent information letter is sent home in Term 1. Acquaintance Night is held early in Term 1. Parent Teacher Interviews are held in Term 1 and written reports are issued at the end of Terms 2 and 4. Parents are actively encouraged to arrange meetings when issues arise, and teachers will contact parents as needed.

Joint programmes:

We liaise closely with the Angle Vale Preschool and work together to implement a transition program that ensures a smooth transition for both parents and students.



5. Sporting Activities

- Students participate in PE lessons. Angle Vale students are involved in SAPSASA summer and winter sports team selections. Aquatics takes place in Term 1 for Year 6 students and swimming lessons are held for Rec-Year 5 students.
- The local Angle Vale community offers cricket, soccer, basketball, football, and netball.

6. Other Co-Curricular Activities

 Co-Curricular activities include a Sports Day, Celebration of Learning Open Day, special sporting programmes, Book Week, and Family Fun Night.

7. Staff (and their welfare)

· Staff profile:

Stable staff, with a mixture of age groups and experience. There is a combination of permanent, tenured and contract staff.

• Leadership structure:

The leadership structure consists of the Principal, Deputy Principal, Student Wellbeing Leader, Numeracy and Literacy Coordinator.

- Staff support systems:
 - Junior Primary, Middle Primary and Upper Primary teams all meet in addition to staff meetings. There is the opportunity for these teams to guide their own agendas alongside the school's Site Improvement Plan.
- Performance Management:

All staff are line managed by the Principal, Deputy, or Student Wellbeing Leader. Staff meet with their Line Manager with a set agenda. All staff develop a Performance Development Plan in Term 1 and report on it in Term 4. Performance Development includes discussion, observations, and reflections on progress towards goals. Feedback is provided continually throughout the year.

9. School Facilities

• Buildings and grounds:

The school facilities include an administration block, 3 classroom blocks (Acacia, Melaleuca and Grevillea) Resource Centre and full-sized gymnasium. BER funding allowed the construction of a classroom block with six classrooms, Design and Technology suite and central teaching and learning area. There is disabled access to all buildings. A single transportable building has been refurbished into a canteen. One DEMAC building is no longer in use and has been identified for removal. During 2024 the administration block, Acacia and Melaleuca buildings, Resource Centre and gym foyer and toilets were painted. Junior Primary toilets were also refurbished in 2024.

Heating and cooling:
 All buildings have heating and cooling.

 Students have access to a Resource Centre and full-size gymnasium.


Student facilities:

10. Local Community

General characteristics:

With the area experiencing continued housing development the local demographics has changed. There are a number of younger families who have moved to the area to build their first home. The area has a number of industries including manufacturing, market gardening, flowers and vineyards.

Parents are invited to participate in a range of activities, which include Governing Council, membership of Governing Council sub-committees, and volunteering on camps and excursions

Feeder or destination schools:

Riverbanks College is the feeder high school for students.

Angle Vale Preschool is located next door resulting in a number of Reception enrolments.
